- **IPP-V Project:** NMMC's health department launched the "Indian Population Project – V" with financial assistance of Rs. 150 million from the World Bank, which features a five-tier health infrastructure:
  1. Information Education & Communication Van
  2. Mobile Clinics
  3. Urban Health Post
  4. Maternal & Child Health Centre
  5. General Hospital
- **Future Plans:** the New Urban Health Post – Number 7 will make specialty services available at the General Hospital by leasing out the premises to the Trauma Care Unit Project by PATH for mothers & newborn children.
